Dear congregation at Grace and Glory:

No Sunday morning doldrums at Grace and Glory this summer! We are planning for some stimulating conversation around family, values, and the rearing of children in a high anxiety, anything-goes climate. From 9:30-10 AM on Sunday mornings beginning June 13 for eight consecutive weeks we will ask the question: "Did Grandma Get It Right?" Our goal is for this to be a relaxed, informal conversation that is truly intergenerational. Bring the baby—no childcare needed. Each session is self-contained, so if you are on vacation two weeks in a row, you can fall right back into participation the following Sunday.

Congregational Meeting Summary

The Annual Spring Congregational Meeting was held on May 2, 2010 immediately after worship, with 50 active members in attendance.

The first order of business was reelection of three members of the Leadership Team. Reelected to their current offices were Frits Geurtsen as Congregational President, Terry Shifflett as Youth and Education Committee chair, and Carol Parsons as Treasurer. President Geurtsen stated that more members should consider serving, and that a committee is being formed to investigate Constitutional changes such as shorter term limits.

Also approved were four members who have agreed to serve as Delegates to the Synod Assembly. They are Janice Brown and Carol Parsons (adults) and Amanda Downs and Kyle Jenkins (youth).

An offer of \$30,000 had been made for sale of the donated property at Lake Monticello. It is less than the latest asking price of \$48,000, but in line with comparable sales and probably the best we can expect in this economic climate. The Leadership Team approved the acceptance of that offer and the congregation voted unanimously to accept it as well.

Building Task Force member Lou Cooper presented an update of the building progress. He thanked the many members of various committees who have been diligently working to bring us to this point. Nielsen Contractors has been hired for preconstruction services and will begin working with the architect within the next few weeks. Work has begun on hooking into the sewer line on route 53. Keith Cuda will be our sole representative working with the contractor.

Pastor Albright stated that the donated property was given in faith and as a blessing, and the donors agreed that it would be sold when it was the right time. It is indeed a blessing for our congregation to now be able to make use of this gift.

Leadership Team Meeting - May 10

The leadership team met on May 10 and discussed the following items:

Treasurer Carol Parsons reported that Fluvanna County has raised the valuation of the church property from \$109,000 to \$111,000. Gabi Dech has agreed to

have her name put on the church debit card, as now required by the bank.

Administration chair Larry Teal reported some issues with the sale of the donated property. All necessary documentation required of us was completed, but our lawyer's office has notified us that we will need a court order in order to complete the sale. (This is now a requirement for the sale of any church-owned property.) The buyers hoped to close by May 12, but since we are now tied up waiting for the court order, closing was postponed with everyone's agreement.

Four young people will reaffirm their baptism on Sunday, May 16 and will be accepted into confirmed membership. They are Julia Albright, Conor Bredder, Kyle Jenkins and Katie Shifflette. New members Chris and Sharon Williams, Selena Nelson, and Jim Reeves will be accepted June 13.

Plans were made for modifying the webpage, since content does not always appear to be updated in a timely fashion. Everyone with a section on the webpage will be reminded to keep their information current and fresh. Marilyn Crowther will continue to do the actual website maintenance.

Pastor Albright has prepared a curriculum for summer Sundays, replacing the current Education Hour. It will be titled "Did Grandma Get It Right?" and offer an intergenerational approach to discussions of parenting. Each session will be led by an older "grandparent" and a younger "parent." Volunteers from the Leadership Team were invited to take part; volunteering was Janet Rockafellow for June 20, Carol Parsons for June 27, and Pastor Albright for July 11.

Carol Parsons will hold a kickoff meeting for planning landscaping for the church property on Sunday, May 16 after worship. She is initiating this committee since landscaping will not be dealt with by the architects or the Building Task Force. Anyone with an interest in landscaping is invited to join.

Paul Crowther has agreed to serve on the Mutual Ministry Committee for a three-year term, replacing Carol Sanders, whose term had expired.

There will be a change in Gabi Dech's hours in the office from June 1 through August 6. She will be available on Mondays from 9:00 - 2:00, on Thursdays from 8:00 - 2:00, and on Fridays from 9:00 - 1:00.

Fluvanna Christian Service Society (FCSS) Report

Our last meeting was held on May 13th. For the food bank, 133 families (291 individuals) were served in March and 109 families (248 individuals) in April. Grace and Glory's own food bank donations were 21 bags in March, 26 bags in April, and 15 bags in May. The US Postal Service (Palmyra and Troy) had a food collection in April and collected 10 truck loads of non-perishables, which gave the food bank a big boost in canned vegetables and fruit during the summer months when children are home. The three items most needed now are pancake mix, syrup and jelly. I'd like to suggest that for our June 20th collection, we bring only these items. However, ANYTHING will be appreciated. If you wish to make a monetary donation instead, please give it to Justin Wade, FCSS treasurer, made out to FCSS. Monetary contributions are used for assistance in paying utilities, rent, medical expenses, and food items that need to be purchased. (such as meat).

FCSS also hosted the Baccalaureate Service for Fluvanna High School on May 16th. Brian Orahod of Lake Christian Church, who is our FCSS director, was the speaker.

Sewer Pipeline Installed; Church Plans Proceeding

Progress is being made on several fronts as the congregation moves forward in its quest to build a brand new church on the 10-acre site we own on Route 53.

During the first two weeks of May, the sewer pipeline that will eventually link the building to the county's new sewer pipeline was installed by Shelbeck Excavating Inc. of Scottsville. Two manholes were installed and about 260 feet of 12-inch pipe was placed under Route 53, to link up with the county's sewer line. An additional 600 feet of 6-inch pipe was buried on our property, extending from the northeast corner to a spot close to where our new church building will eventually be located.

In mid May, the Interior Design Team -- a committee that is under the co-chairmanship of Janet Rockafellow, Barbara Smith and Ed Martell -- filled out a detailed Space Needs Analysis document, which identifies and pinpoints our congregation's anticipated use, furniture and equipment, mechanical, electrical and plumbing needs for all of the rooms that will be included in the proposed new building. Their recommendations have been forwarded to Hughes Associates Architects and to Nielsen Builders, Inc., the two firms that are currently working together to plan, develop and come up with cost estimates for our proposed facility.

In addition, Carol Parsons is in the process of forming a Landscaping Committee that will come up with ideas and suggestions for the types of plants, trees and other foliage that will eventually appear on our new church property. A preliminary planning meeting was held on May 16, and additional meetings will be held in the coming weeks and months. Contact Carol (589-6068) if you have questions or would like more information.

Our architectural firm, Hughes Associates, likes to follow what they call a "team build" approach when it comes to designing and developing a new church structure. Under that approach, the architect works closely with a builder and the congregation to finalize plans and come up with cost estimates. The first "team build" meeting, involving representatives of Hughes, Nielsen and members of the Grace & Glory Church Building Steering Committee was held on May 17.

At that meeting, Martha Chester of Hughes Associates reviewed large-sized drawings depicting proposed revisions to the church floor plans, the elevations, and a portion of a building section. There was extensive discussion regarding the proposed changes. Martha assured everyone that she would have additional revisions made to the drawings based on the recommendations she was receiving and that these would be reviewed by the Church Building Steering Committee before they are finalized. Martha also handed out a proposed finish schedule, and briefly discussed the possible finishes for various spaces in the proposed new building.

Representatives of Nielsen who were present indicated that detailed budget breakouts for the construction phase would be prepared in the coming few weeks pertaining to the base bid for the new church building and for any and all site work. They said it would take Nielsen between four and five weeks to begin to come up with estimated cost figures for various phases of the construction project. Nielsen officials also distributed a blank suggested time line for the project, which will need to be filled in as we move from the Design Stage Kickoff meeting (May 17) through to such steps as Schematic Design development and finalizing, site plan development, building permit review by the county and the eventual beginning of building construction.

Martha Chester handed out two documents that had been prepared by Hughes -- a four-page "Outline Scope of Work--Mechanical" and a two-page "Outline Scope of Work--Electrical." Martha explained that the Mechanical Scope document describes the plumbing and HVAC systems proposed for the new church facility and the Electrical Scope document describes the electrical work that will be required for the structure. She said the design information in both documents was preliminary and is intended only to establish an initial budget. However, she urged Grace & Glory members to review the documents carefully for any modifications that might need to be made. Copies of these documents are included as part of the minutes of the meeting and can be reviewed by those who wish to examine them in the church office.

Several weeks ago, the Steering Committee had asked Hughes Associates to invite several acoustical consulting firms to submit bids for an acoustical review of the proposed church design to assure that the

proposed sanctuary room acoustics provide a space with speech clarity, which is also music friendly. Bids were received from four firms -- two in Charlottesville and two in North Carolina. After review of the four bids and extensive discussion, the Steering Committee voted unanimously to retain the services of Stewart Acoustical Consultants of Raleigh, NC at a fixed fee price not to exceed \$2,500 to work with Hughes Associates Architects in designing and carrying out a room acoustics study that would focus special attention on the speech and music acoustic needs in the sanctuary.

The congregation is anxious to construct a new church building that -- taking cost into consideration -- is as green or environmentally friendly as possible. Martha submitted to the Steering Committee a list of 23 LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) principles that she felt could be achieved by Grace & Glory as part of this construction project, all of which she felt are reasonable in their cost and execution. Included on the list were such items as designating a portion of the church parking lot for preferred parking for low-emitting and fuel efficient vehicles ... providing preferred parking for carpools or vanpools ... provide electric light pollution reduction, following guidelines for interior and exterior zones ... selecting high efficiency toilet fixtures ... using rapidly renewable and locally-available materials where practical ... and using low emitting adhesives, sealants, paints and coatings where practical. A complete list of the 23 LEED principles appears as part of the minutes of the May 17 meeting and are on file in the church office.

There are a number of tasks that Hughes, Nielsen and Grace & Glory need to follow up on before any further "team build" meetings can take place. Walt Lindenmann, Building Steering Committee chairman, suggested that the Steering Committee hold a joint meeting with the Interior Design Team to review some of the proposed building design changes and also to review the proposed mechanical and electrical components of the project. A joint meeting has been scheduled for 9 AM on Friday, June 4 in the church office.

The next "team build" meeting involving representatives of Hughes, Nielsen and the Building Steering Committee has been scheduled for 10 AM on Monday, June 28 in the church office.

Shaped by the Master's Hands



Pastor Susan Briehl will be the keynote speaker, Dr. Diane Jacobsen will lead Bible study and famed musician, Dr. Marty Haugen, will be the music presenter for the annual Power in the Spirit event at Roanoke College on July 8-10. The theme will be "Shaped by the Master's Hands."

Through talks, Bible studies, worship and classes, those attending Power in the Spirit "will enter into the wonder and mystery of God's shaping in our lives. This is discipleship," according to Elizabeth Smythe, coordinator of the summer event.

Briehl has been director of Holden Village, a Lutheran center for renewal in Washington State, campus pastor at Pacific Lutheran University and pastor of a church in Bellingham, Wash. She lives in Spokane, Wash., and is a professor of the art of ministry at Wartburg Seminary. She has written several books and hymn texts.

Jacobson, director of the ELCA Book of Faith Initiative, formerly was Old Testament professor and an associate dean at Luther Seminary. She also taught at New York and Union Seminaries. A frequent speaker, she is an associate in ministry (AIM).

Haugen, a pianist and composer of liturgical music, is composer in residence at Mayflower Community Congregational Church in Minneapolis. He has composed many liturgy settings, choral arrangements, sacred songs and hymns, and he is a performing musician. He has written four liturgies for the ELCA, including Holden Evening Prayer.

In the three-day session, workshops will be held on many subjects, including what the church is doing in the world, environmental thought, choral reading, bringing youth to an adult faith, impact of the economy on congregations, the Sermon on the Mount, a brief history of the Virginia Synod, challenges of engagement with the Bible, responding to victims of sexual assault and violence, baptism and worship settings.
