## **Leadership Team Meeting Summary**

The Leadership Team met September 13, 2010 and discussed the following:

Lou Cooper from the Building Task Force informed the Leadership Team of the progress made in the building plans since our last meeting. The Steering Committee went back to the architect and contractor for revisions to the plans, to bring the costs more in line with our budget. Hughes and Associates subsequently contacted a second contractor for an estimate, but that one was not acceptable to the Steering Committee. Nielsen also submitted a second estimate which was closer to budget. However, the information received was not thorough enough for the Steering Committee to know exactly what specifications were included in the estimate. The Steering Committee is gathering more information from the architect, as well as looking for ways to cut costs, perhaps by doing some of the work ourselves.

The resignation of Paul St Clair from the Leadership Team was accepted with regret, and Justin Wade was appointed interim chair of the Evangelism Committee and Carol Parsons as LT liaison.

Jeff Chervenak and Kayla Ferguson will be accepted into membership on September 19. Brent and Bernadette Hawkins and daughter Brynn were approved for membership and will probably be accepted sometime in November.

Administration chair Larry Teal reminded all committee chairs that their budget needs for 2011 should be submitted to him as soon as possible.

The possibility of Grace & Glory youth raising funds by working with Aramark was discussed at length. Aramark, which supplies concessions for various local events, allows groups to supply workers for a percentage of the proceeds. Our Youth Ministry committee has suggested that Grace and Glory youth could do this as a fund raiser for their activities, and Ken Duffau has offered to serve as coordinator. However, until more is known about age requirements, availability of desirable locations, clothing requirements, and whether or not we have enough youth and their parents who will commit to

doing this, approval was tabled until the next Leadership Team meeting.

Hospice of the Piedmont was given approval for use of our office space to conduct a grief workshop for 12-15 people on November 10 from 6:00 - 8:00 PM.

A draft Wedding Policy was discussed and changes proposed.

The decision was made to post notices of community events being held by nonprofit groups in the church office. A small bulletin board will be acquired for this purpose.

Jane and I just returned from a wonderful trip out to Wyoming, in part to celebrate our anniversary but also my return to health. We stayed in a cabin situated between the Grand Tetons and Yellowstone National Park and had lots of fun hiking, horseback riding, whitewater rafting, etc. It would be a significant understatement to say that everything we saw out there was achingly beautiful. Gazing at the mountains everyday brought to mind the lyrics:

*O Lord my God  
When I in awesome wonder  
Consider all the works  
Thy hands have made ...*

Each day brought with it extraordinary new wonders, whether yet another startling view of the towering spires of the Tetons, the striking fall foliage of the aspens, sparkling cascades, the breathtaking gorge of the Yellowstone River, the wondrous geysers and sulphurous hot pools, or the abundant wild creatures (that weren't eating our garden).

One phenomenon that struck us as we drove and hiked through the parks was that we would occasionally come upon groups of people all focused on something initially unseen by us. As newcomers joined the crowd, someone would helpfully point out what everyone else was looking at. Binoculars were often shared with perfect strangers.

As we who already believe stand in awe of our Lord God and point out His works, others will be drawn to us and will want to see what it is that we see. They just need to be pointed in the right direction. And perhaps given help in seeing it for themselves.

Here at Grace & Glory, let's all make a point of making our observations as visible as possible so that others will indeed want to join in. And then let's help them to see what we see, so that they too can one day join with us in the refrain:

*Then sings my soul

## Efforts Underway To Reduce Church Building Costs

Several steps have been taken in recent weeks to reduce the overall costs for Grace and Glory's proposed new church building.

These include reducing the number of classrooms from five to four and developing plans to have only a small portion of the parking area paved, with the largest portion of the parking lot being covered in gravel instead of in asphalt.

In addition, consideration is being given to having all of the cabinets in the proposed new structure designed and built by local craftsmen, rather than installed by the builder, in an effort to dramatically cut costs while at the same time following environmental or "green" guidelines that call for relying as much as possible on local resources when planning a church facility.

In an article in the September issue of *Grace Notes*, we had pointed out that there was a major gap between the amount of funds the congregation anticipates will be available to put up the new facility, compared to the preliminary budget estimates quoted by our preconstruction building services consultant, Nielsen, Inc. Since that time, the gap has been reduced, but we still need to cut material costs further in order to remain on target from a budgetary standpoint.

The floor plan for the new building has been revised. Attached is a rendering that we anticipate will be the final version of the floor plan for Phase 1 of the construction effort. Classroom 1 will serve as the nursery. Eventually, there will be a partition separating classrooms 2 and 3. The conference room -- opposite the offices for the Pastor and secretary -- can be used as a fourth classroom. Eliminating the fifth classroom will save \$16,000.

We now anticipate that there will be parking spaces for 78 vehicles. Of the planned parking spaces, 58 will be on the side of the building leading to Lobby A -- the hallway located between the Conference Room and the offices for the Pastor and secretary. Of those 58 parking spaces, 30 will be paved and 28 unpaved. There will be an additional 20 unpaved parking spaces on the side of the building leading to Lobby B and the kitchen.

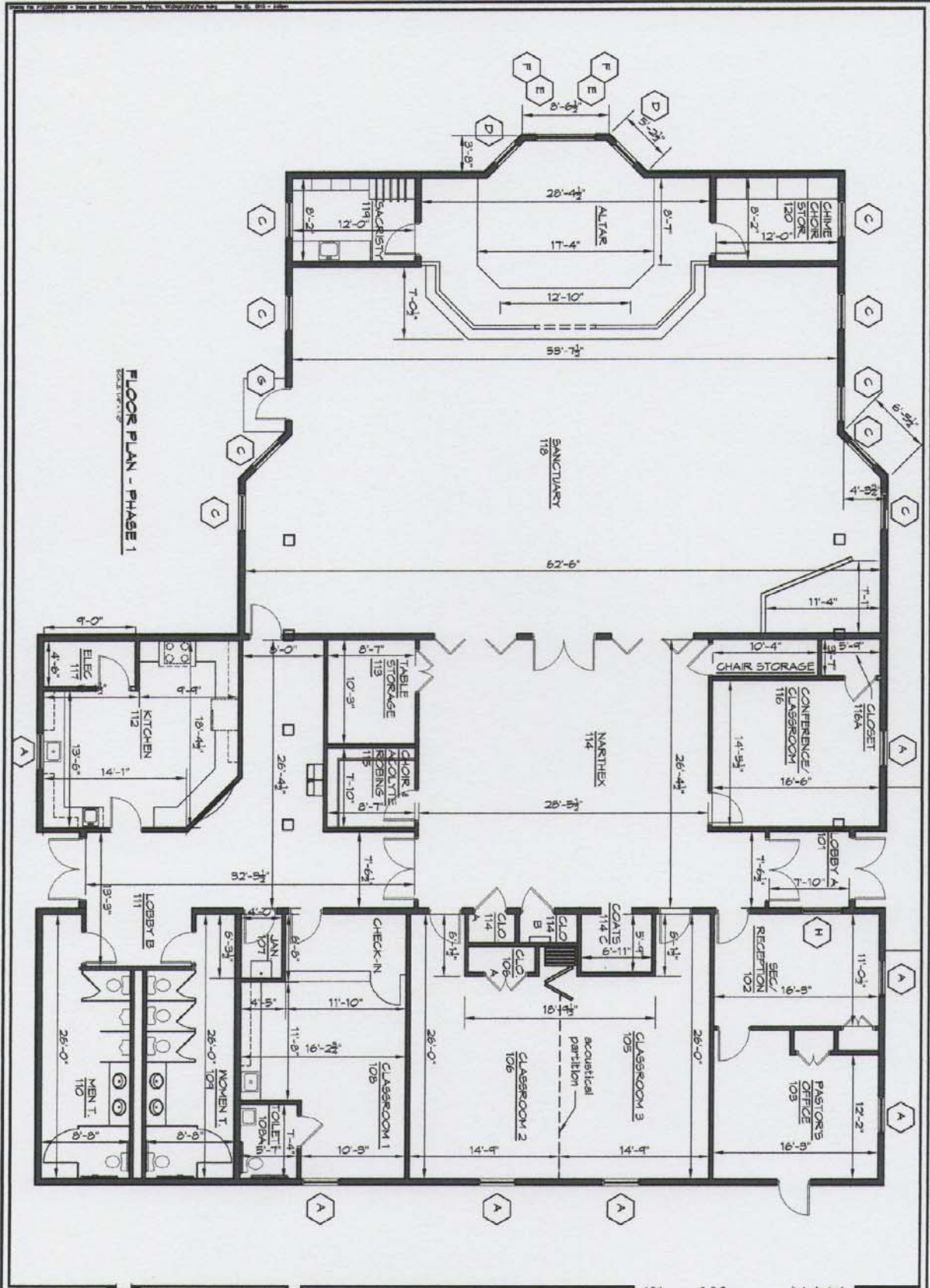
Discussion is still underway regarding the types of materials to use on the exterior of the building. A decision should be made within a few weeks. At the present time, Nielsen is being asked to cost out various options, including the possibility of stone on the front (the portion of the building facing Route 53), complemented by a mix of either brick, hardie plank, or vinyl siding, depending on the possible cost for each.

The Church Building Steering Committee has asked our architectural firm -- Hughes Associates -- and our preconstruction services building consultant -- Nielsen, to plan for carpeting throughout the facility, with the exception of tile in the nursery and a hardwood floor in a portion of the altar area.

Be assured that congregation members will be notified, as soon as further decisions are made regarding the final floor and site plans.

## **5Gs October Outing:**

The Golden Gals and Guys of Grace and Glory are planning a trip to Appomattox Courthouse on Wednesday, October 27<sup>th</sup>. We did a 'dry run' and learned that it was an hour and a half drive, 61 miles, traveling south on Rte. 15, then west on Rte. 60, and S/W on Rte. 24.

The good news is that it can be a very pretty Fall drive, and admission to this National Park is free if at least one person in the car has a Golden Age Passport; or, if no G.A.P., \$10 for an entire carload of seniors. There's plenty of parking at the Visitors Center, with an informative film shown at the Center on the hour beginning at 10AM, then a talk given 20 minutes past each hour. This is followed by a self-guided tour of the village, where there are several original and reconstructed historic buildings, including the McLean House, where General Robert E. Lee surrendered to General Ulysses S. Grant.

Three miles further on Rte. 24 is the town of Appomattox, where we can lunch at the Babcock House Bed & Breakfast. The atmosphere is charming, the prices very reasonable: \$6.75 to \$6.95 for sandwiches or salads; only \$4.75 for soup and half a sandwich. Desserts are also reasonable!! After lunch, you can choose to visit the Country Charm gift shop on Main Street – a very nice selection of wares.

We will meet at the church office at 8:30AM to coordinate drivers (directions will be supplied), so we can be on our way no later than 8:45AM. This way we'll arrive in time for the 10:20 talk, and then see the film. Sign up sheets will be on the hall table after Sunday services. Questions? ## Why Are Worship Visitors Important?

*Question: Someone told me that only one in ten first-time worship visitors return a second time, a third time, and eventually become members. We don't want our church membership to keep shrinking during the next few years. But does that formula mean we must have 100 first-time visitors in order to add 10 new members?*

*Answer: Like so many generalities, that formula contains some truth, but not enough! Review the following list of additional and equally important factors. Decide which of these predict your church's future.*

*What percent of your worshippers are visiting for the first visit? On average, 2 percent of worshipers in churches across the U.S. have never previously attended that congregation. Without that 2 percent of first-time visitors, most churches grow smaller each year.*

*What percent of worshippers previously attended this church but are not yet members? On average—in addition to the 2 percent that have never previously attended that church—another 8 percent of each week's worshippers in churches across the U.S. are not members of that congregation.*

*What percent of first-time visitors return a second time, a third time, and eventually—after several months or years—become members? On average, the answer is 10 percent. But a few congregations achieve 20 percent. And in a micro-list of fast-growing congregations, 30 percent of first-time worship visitors eventually become members. That percent is more important to your church's future than its number of first-time visitors.*

*What causes an increase in first-time worship visitors? A major factor is your congregation's positive reputation in the community. When that is the case (a) members derive significant spiritual meaning from their church, (b) more members spontaneously invite, and (c) more people respond to those invitations.*

*More than 75 percent of new members in churches across the U.S. visit a worship service the first time because they were invited by someone who worships in that congregation.*

*What other factors increase the number of first-time visitors? Inviting people is essential. But by themselves, methods are like an airplane without an engine. First-time worship visitors result from a mixture of numerous factors within four major influences:*

*God's Spirit: What God does by the Spirit's interaction with the flow of each individual's life, circumstances, and needs is the invisible influence without which no inviting methods work.*

*The Congregation's Actions: What the congregation does to help meet the spiritual, psychological, emotional, and relational needs of individuals increases their receptivity to the influence of God's Spirit.*

*Power of Prayer: If you want your congregation to find and retain the use of effective methods, influence your members to pray for God's Spirit to touch the lives of people who need God's presence.*

*The Bottom Line: God provides the spark of Grace for spiritual transformation. But God expects assistance from assistants. Invite a friend to church this week.*
