LT Meeting Summary

The Leadership Team met on May 9 and discussed the following:

Treasurer Carol Parsons reported that there was a shortfall in one of our deposits, according to the bank. Since there is no way to dispute this, it may have to be our loss. In April, there was enough income to meet expenses, but income for May is already lagging. We need to watch expenses and stick to the budget! The Audit Committee has been meeting with Treasurer Parsons but the audit is not yet completed.

Nominating Committee chair Janice Brown reported that there are nominees for three of the five positions: Evangelism, Parish Life and Care, and the new Youth member. The positions of Secretary and Administration chair have not yet been filled. In addition, Lou Cooper has consented to serve as Trustee and Joe and Patty Shaver, Amanda Downs and Kyle Jenkins have volunteered to serve as delegates to the Synod Assembly.

Plans remain underway for groundbreaking, but the date has been pushed back until late June or early July.

Our loan application with the Mission Investment Fund will be considered May 11. We do not yet have final construction costs, so any approval will be preliminary. Also, Virginia law requires that non-profit organizations such as a church petition the court before obtaining a loan.

A newsletter called "Journeys" will be purchased from Hospice. Cost is \$15 per year and issues will be kept in the office and distributed to anyone who is grieving.

New church signs will be installed on the church property. These are only temporary signs and will need to be removed when a Certificate of Occupancy is granted after completion of the new church building.

Spring Congregational Meeting Summary

The Annual Spring Congregational Meeting was held on Sunday May 22 with 51 members in attendance.

President Geurtsen began the meeting by explaining that the Leadership Team has been discussing making changes to the Leadership Team structure, and the first suggestion will be to shorten members' terms from 3 years to 2. This will be done on a trial basis only, without making a Constitutional change at this time. Discussion followed, including a question regarding the time frame for review of the success of the change, which will be after one year; whether the change will affect existing terms, which it will since 5 positions will change every year with the exception of the youth member, and some existing terms will be shortened to accommodate the new schedule of term limits. The congregation approved this change unanimously.

President Geurtsen then explained the new position of Youth member, which has been encouraged by the ELCA. This will be a one-year term, and may possibly later even be shortened to 6 months to involve as many different youth as possible. Discussion followed, including questions about whether there has been conversation with youth members about this, and the answer was yes; and whether there will be minimum and maximum ages for this position. President Geurtsen suggested that youth within the range of post reaffirmation of baptism and pre high school graduation be eligible. Ray Weimer noted that in his previous church, the youth decided among themselves who would serve. The new position was approved unanimously.

Nominating Committee Janice Brown presented the slate of nominees as follows:

Evangelism -- Joe Shaver
Parish Life and Care -- Carol Sanders
Administration (1 yr) -- Larry Teal
Secretary -- Monica Daniels
Youth member (1 yr) -- Katey Sanders

All were elected unanimously.

President Geurtsen expressed deep appreciation to the two Leadership Team members whose terms were ending: Patty Shaver and Janet Rockafellow.

He also explained that due to the death of Dick Haas, appointment of a new trustee is necessary. Lou Cooper has offered to serve in that capacity and was approved unanimously by the congregation.

President Geurtsen said Kyle Jenkins and Amanda Downs have volunteered to serve as youth delegates to this year's Synod Assembly and that Joe and Patty Shaver had planned to serve as our adult delegates. However, due to health issues, the Shavers cannot attend. Janice Brown volunteered from the floor to serve, but an additional adult delegate is still needed. The congregation approved those three delegates, but the Leadership Team will need to select a fourth.

Walter Lindenmann, Building Steering Committee chair, reported that our preliminary loan application was approved by the Mission investment Fund (MIF), in the amount of \$602,000. Architects Hughes & Associates have submitted the final drawings to the building contractor, Nielsen, for final costs. Nielsen in turn has requested bids from at least three contractors on each subcontract, and final bids should be received by June 7 or 8. The Steering Committee will then have to review and approve the final figure, as will the Leadership Team, before it comes to the congregation for a vote at a special congregational meeting. Groundbreaking should be held sometime in July or August, with work beginning soon after that. He also stated that the figures will need to come in at \$1.1 million or less, since the amount of money we have on hand, been pledged, granted or borrowed totals \$1,352,538, and there are some additional expenses to be covered. President Geurtsen added that he has been in contact with Devin Burg of the MIF who stated that we can still be approved for more without any problems but we are hoping that we will not have to do so, since that would increase our monthly mortgage cost.

Pastor Albright presented his observations of the past year. We have been a grieving congregation due to the deaths of three vital members: Ann Milstead, Carol Benske and Dick Haas. We appreciate the efforts of our women who have coordinated the food for funerals, especially without benefit of our own facility, particularly Ester Teal and Patty Shaver. We plan to provide a monthly newsletter called "Journeys" for those who are grieving. In addition, much will be happening over this summer: development of a handbell choir; a summer Sunday series called What Does God Expect of Us?; our annual mission trip to

Hurley; and development of a men's group for Saturday breakfast meetings. We still need to work on several areas though, including paying more attention to involving more people in committees. We also need to change our approach to youth and education, and an evaluative process in that regard will take place this summer. We need to continue our work with missions, since we are gaining new members through mission work. We need to consider how to expand this, including possibly going to Alabama to help repair the damage from the recent tornadoes there.

President Geurtsen closed the meeting by stating that of all the messages he has written for Grace Notes, the one that has brought him the most feedback was the one about it being okay to say No, but he reminded everyone that it should be on the way to discovering their individual Yes. He offered a closing prayer of thanksgiving for the work of the congregation, and for those who did say "Yes" when asked.

President's Message

As I mentioned at the recent congregational meeting, of all of the President's Messages that I have written for Grace Notes, the one I've gotten the most feedback on – and had quoted back to me most often – was one in which I stated that it's okay to say No.

That's not all that I said in that message though.

I said it's okay to say No when you don't sense that it's God's will for you to be involved in a particular activity. Or when you already have too much on your plate and it's starting to affect your family life or health or job. Or when the opportunity doesn't match your spiritual gifts. Or when the activity doesn't fit your work schedule. Or when you're just physically unable to do what is required.

All of those are perfectly legitimate reasons to say No and you should never feel guilty (or let someone else make you feel guilty) about saying No in these circumstances.

So, when should your answer be Yes?

In my experience, prayer has always been the place to start. Ask God what he wants you to be doing. One of the things that the Holy Spirit is best at doing is nudging. If you feel that happening in regard to a particular opportunity, then that's probably the one for you.

Talk to your friends or family if you feel you're being led to try a new opportunity and see what they say. You may be surprised to discover that they've already been nudged by the Holy Spirit on your behalf and can confirm what you're feeling.

Sometimes you need to say No to something you've been doing for quite a while in order to say Yes to something else. That has the added benefit of perhaps making room for someone else to say Yes to what you'd been doing before.

As we approach the reality of our own church facility and all of the new ministry opportunities that that will generate, please take some time to prayerfully discover what your Yes is meant to be. But don't feel badly about saying No to other opportunities in the process of getting to your Yes.
